Digital Audio Workshop

Digital audio recordings can be used to provide a different dimension to information on your website or can be used to make a CD – whatever your type of group.

- the most obvious for any community or local history website is short stories from local people
- Sports clubs could record accounts of wins or how that all important goal was scored (or saved)!
- Performances of poems or snippets of shows for cultural websites / CDs
- Even experiences of people who have used a service or help group can be recorded

This workshop will cover what digital audio is about and how they can be used in your group, provide practical advice and tips and allow you to exchange ideas with other local groups. We will also be showing how to use the equipment to record and edit interviews.

Oral History Workshop

Summary of Terms

Oral History

Historical information, usually tape-recorded or videotaped, obtained in interviews with persons having firsthand knowledge.

Windows Sound Recorder

Free software recorder supplied with Windows which allows you to simply edit sound files and compress them for use on the internet.

Real Player

A media player, created by RealNetworks, that plays a number of multimedia formats including multiple generations of RealAudio and RealVideo codecs as well as MP3, MPEG-4, QuickTime, etc

QuickTime

Developed by Apple Computer, QuickTime is a method of storing sound, graphics, and movie files.

.wav

File extension, defines the format of the file.

MP3

An MPEG standard used especially for digitally transmitting music over the Internet.

Codec

Technology used to compress and decompress files (audio, video and etc)

Podcast

A digital recording of a radio broadcast or similar programme, made available on the Internet for downloading to a personal audio player.
